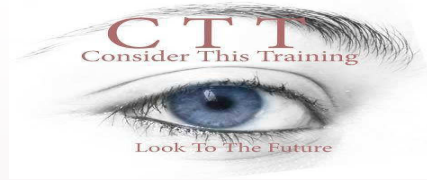

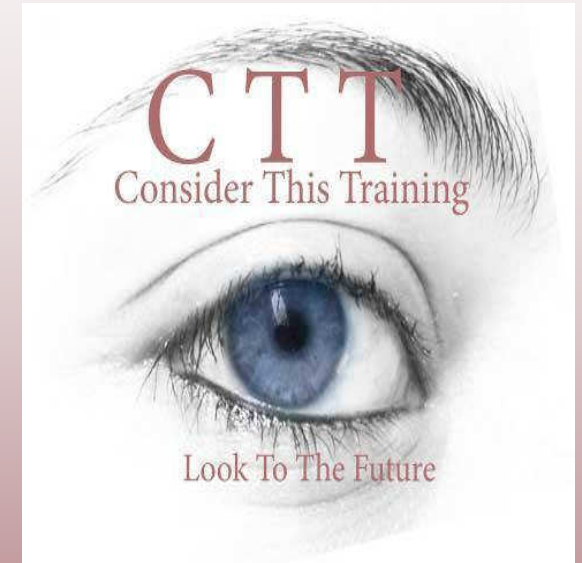

CHC30202 CERTIFICATE III IN HOME AND COMMUNITY CARE

Workers in this occupational group work in the community under regular supervision within clearly defined organisational guidelines and service plans. These workers carry out activities related to the maintenance of an individual's personal care and/or other activities of living. These workers report directly to a supervisor and are not responsible for other workers. Workers at this level are required to have an understanding of Indigenous culture and history and to work with local communities in the provision of services. 15 units must be selected for this following qualification including: 10 core units and 5 elective units

CHCAC1C Provide support to an older person:

This unit describes the knowledge and skills required by workers within their designated role and responsibilities to support an older people maintain their quality of life.



CHCAC2C Provide personal care:

This unit describes the knowledge and skills required by workers to support or assist the older person with their personal care needs within their service delivery plan

CHCHC302B Provide personal care in a home and community environment:

This unit describes the knowledge and skills required by workers to support or assist the older person with their personal care needs within their service delivery plan in a home and community care environment.



CHCAC6C Support the older person to meet their emotional and psychosocial needs :

This unit describes the knowledge and skills required by the worker to support the older person to meet their emotional and psychosocial needs.

CHCAC15A Provide care support which is responsive to the specific nature of Dementia:

Provision of support to clients with dementia in a variety of settings including family houses, community day settings and residential care.



CHCCS401A Facilitate cooperative behavior :

This unit is concerned with the competencies required to respond to unacceptable behaviour and support responsibility for behaviour management and change

CHCCOM2B Communicate appropriately with clients and colleagues:

Exercising effective communication skills in the workplace.



CHCOHS302A Participate in safety procedures for direct care work

Specifically designed to cater for workers who deliver aged care or disabilities services, this is an alternative unit to CHCOHS301A Participate in workplace safety procedures.

CHCAC3C Orientation to aged care

This unit describes the roles and responsibilities by the worker in their role as a carer to perform work that reflects an understanding of the structure and profile of the residential aged care sector and key issues facing older people in the community. This unit applies to all workers in the aged care sector, or those working with older people.



CHCCS405A Work effectively with culturally diverse clients and co-workers

This unit deals with the cultural awareness required for effective communication and cooperation with persons of diverse cultures.

CHCINF8B Comply with information requirements of the aged care and community care sectors

This unit describes the knowledge and skills required by the worker to undertake administrative duties of the role including documenting in client records and contribute to the development and monitoring of service delivery plans in accordance with organisational and duty of care requirements.

CHCHC301B Work effectively in a home and community care environment

This unit covers the introductory skills and knowledge required to work effectively in a home care environment and community settings with clients, family members, staff, visitors, suppliers and others to meet established work requirements. Home care services may include: respite care, personal care, household maintenance, personal assistance and food services. Community settings include shops, streets, parks, day programs, venues and vehicles.

CHCDIS1C Orientation to disability work

This unit is intended to provide an introduction to working with people with a disability.

CHCDIS10B Provide care and support

Providing support and assistance to maintain quality care for people with disabilities.
